
Sabbatical is a gift. I wish to use it wisely! Till we meet again, doing what I love to do, to serve and lead you in worship with you.



JULIE'S NEWS

Ffald y Brenin



Ffald y Brenin is a Christian retreat Centre and House of Prayer located in the Presili valley near Fishguard, West Wales. John and I had the privilege of going 'on retreat' here for 4 days in July 24.

Neither John or I had ever done a retreat before so I was a little uncertain how it would go. As there would be no wifi or internet access whatsoever, I was also very uncertain how John would 'take' to it given that he is very addicted to gadgets. As it was John that had requested going – and I had received several nudges from the Lord – I agreed to give it a go. We stocked up on plenty of Christian books (*I took 8*, *John took 7*. We bought 2 each whilst there and no – we didn't finish them all!) and prepared to discover what the Lord would 'do with us'

It is not a 'led retreat'. The place has a variety of rooms which you can book (cottages, double and single rooms). The rooms have catering facilities as it is self-catering. There are group prayer sessions in the morning and evening where the hosts and all guests come together. During this time, prayers and hymns are sung as people felt led. Whilst we were there, one group were led to sing Psalm 23 in the Shona language. It felt as if we had entered heaven. The rest of the time, you are free to walk the hills, spend time in the chapel, read in your room or the common rooms, or simply relax.

Whilst there, I started to discover 'things happening' that I couldn't quite explain. On the Sunday evening (around 7.30pm), I was in the common room reading the Bible, I looked out — and noticed one quarter of a rainbow. It was completely unexpected as it wasn't normal conditions for a rainbow and it wasn't a full one. Whilst I was watching, I could literally see that section only forming and constructing. 5 minutes later — it had all gone.

During the night, I woke singing a hymn. I would hum the first line then would sing 'the glory of the risen Lord'. I had no idea what the hymn was – but it went on all night – I just had to go 'with it'. I asked John if he knew what it was and he said 'All Heaven declares'. I thought – 'OK – wonder why I was singing that'. At the prayer meeting, the leader said that he had had the first hymn planned but on the way in, he was led to change it to hymn 10. When we opened the book to Hymn 10 – it was 'All Heaven declares'.

All the above may seem very interesting – but the greatest miracle (and to me – it is a miracle) is that the Lord intervened and has worked wonders with regards my migraines. As many will know, I have suffered greatly with migraines for the last 30 years. Until I got treated with Botox injections, I was having severe migraines every day – hence my having to give up full time work! 10 years ago, I got Botox injections, which did reduce the migraines down to 8 to 10 a month and the severity down to mild/moderate – but still has an impact.

Since, I have been to Ffald y Brenin, the number of migraines I have had is on single figures. The couple I have had have been so mild that I have not really noticed them. I haven't had to order my usual triptan tablets for months as I haven't been using them (and normally I'm ordering them all the time!).

As part of my Botox treatment, I have to keep a headache diary. The Nurse commented that my last diary was unusual in that it showed a complete drop off in headaches from July onwards — when the number of headaches should have been increasing due to the Botox wearing off! She asked if I knew the cause and I could only say 'Ffald y Brenin and the Lord!'

I would just like to say that I wasn't certain if I fully believed if miracles still happened – I do now! I also perhaps have an understanding of how some of the people who were recipients of Jesus' healings felt afterwards. Yes, I am very happy – but also very confused. Ultimately though – I am thanking the Lord!

SCAMS

We all want to give and receive love, unfortunately scammers understand this Only too well

Romance scams involve people being duped into sending money to criminals who go to great lengths to gain their trust and convince them that they are in a genuine relationship.

They can build up a relationship over many weeks, even months, before beginning to manipulate, persuade and exploit so that requests for money do not raise alarm bells.

These requests might be highly emotive, such as criminals claiming they need money for emergency medical care, or to pay for transport costs to visit the victim if they are overseas.

Fraudsters are also likely to exploit the concerns around gas prices in various ways, eg.

- Knocking on your door offering scam deals,
- phone calls around new gas takeovers or
- phishing emails and texts asking you to update personal and/or financial information.

If an offer sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

If you are asked for personal details, especially bank details, DO NOT give them.

Lloyds Bank estimates that more than £1 million could have been lost in the UK to fraudsters selling fake Taylor Swift tickets.

The warning comes after the bank received over 600 scam reports from its customers.

To avoid ticket scams:

Stick to official retailers and competitions.

Be wary of buying tickets from sellers on social media as many ticket scams begin on these platforms.

Be suspicious of too good to be true prices.

Don't pay via bank transfer as you'll have a hard time being reimbursed if you do.
