#### Dear Friends,

When I woke up on Sunday morning, not only was there a bright blue sky, but I also noticed that the mornings are getting lighter. It might have been frosty outside, but there was a definite change in the lengthening of the days. When February comes, I always notice that we've turned a corner in the hours of sunlight.

The Circuit Prayer Diary for last weekend reminded me that it was Candlemas which is 40 days after Christmas. It marks the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple by his parents as recorded in Luke 2.22-40. Some churches, especially in Anglican and Roman Catholic traditions, make more of marking that period of the 40 days after Christmas. Some will keep their Christmas trees up until Candlemas and have special services on 2nd February.

One of the churches we prayed for in the Prayer Diary on Sunday was St Michael's Church, Sheerwater. Providentially, I had popped into St Michael's the week before, on a visit around that part of the Circuit. The church had a Christmas tree up (pictured) but it was a tree with a difference. The children of the Pop-Up Café at St Michael's had made a bug hotel to make room for others, including little insects. Made from recycled and eco friendly materials, the tree shows how Jesus came to save the whole world – bugs and all.



When February and Candlemas come along, the days gradually get longer following the darkness of January, which for many is a dreary month. Yet it's not all brightness yet. Monday 3rd as I write this, is an overcast and grey day. We also have the season of Lent to come as we share the journey of Jesus to Jerusalem and the Cross. Some churches turn their Christmas tree into a cross during Lent and then decorate it with flowers on Easter Day.

Although it can still be cold at this time of year, and the hours of darkness still outnumber the hours of light, we look forward with hope and expectation to the new life and light which Jesus offers to the whole creation – bugs and all.


